## LOMAX AWARD

**Criteria** – 1) A tribute to our club, 2) Gives club support, 3) Well-rounded skater

High Level – For the best SCSFSC citizen (good sportsmanship) Intermediate and above

Low Level – For the best SCSFSC citizen (good sportsmanship) Juvenile and below

## VIVIANI AWARD

**Criteria** – skater with the most accumulated points from May 1 to April 30

High Level – For the most active USFS participant in individual, pair and synchronized skating competitions – Intermediate and above
--

Low Level – For the most active USFS participant in individual, pair and synchronized skating competitions – Juvenile and below
---

**Points** – These results must be submitted by skater, their parent or coach.  
They will then be tabulated by the banquet committee.

1 pt. per event, all non-qualifying competitions

2 pts. Per event @ Shores Autumn Classic
--

2 pts. Per non-qualifying event @EGL Regional competitions
--

2 pts. Per non-qualifying event @ Midwestern competitions (Synchro)

3 pts. Per qualifying event @ EGL Regional competitions

4 pts. Per qualifying @ EGL Midwestern Sectional competitions

5 pts. Per event @ Midwestern Sectional Competitions

6 pts. Per ISU International, World and Olympic competitions

## **PRESIDENTS AWARD**

**Criteria** - Skater with the most accumulated points from single competition placements and tests passed from May 1 to April 30 (does not include synchro)

High Level – For the most successful individual, pairs or dance skater – Intermediate and above
---

Low Level – For the most successful individual, pairs or dance skater – Juvenile and below
--

**Points** - These results must be submitted by skater, their parent or coach.  
They will then be tabulated by the banquet committee.

### **Points- for Medals**

5 pts. – Gold
4 pts – Silver
3 pts – Bronze
2 pts – 4 <sup>th</sup> place
1 pt – 5 <sup>th</sup> place

### **Points - for Tests**

1 pt per Dance Test
2 pts per Field Move Test
3 pts per Freestyle Test

## **SCHOLASTIC AWARD**

This scholarship is presented to any USFS club skater who is a Junior or Senior in high school with a cumulative GPA of 3.4 or above. The skater must have participated in a qualifying competition in any skating discipline (including synchro) during the competitive season. A maximum of five scholarships are awarded.

Any skater who meets the above criteria must submit a copy of their school transcript showing their cumulative GPA and a qualifying competition result sheet. The Board of Directors will then review all applicants and decide recipients(s) prior to the banquet.

**TO BE CONSIDERED FOR ANY OF THE ABOVE AWARDS, YOU MUST HAVE PARTICIPATED IN THE “REFLECTIONS ON ICE” SHOW IN THE CURRENT YEAR OF THE AWARD**
